TV preacher Jesse Duplantis is asking his followers to send \$54 million as an offering to his ministry. Not to feed the poor. Or heal the sick. Or give shelter to refugees.

No, he says he needs another jet. His fourth private jet, in fact. He needs it to go nonstop anywhere in the world to get God’s message out to the world even faster. And God told him to buy it, so no one can argue with that, right?

He’s not the only evangelist with a jet. Earlier on this year Kenneth Copeland also bought a jet, and there are some reports that Creflo Dollar did as well.

In one article, Copeland offers some explanation for his need for a jet. He noted that televangelist Oral Roberts had flown on commercial flights at one time. But, Copeland argues, “even back then it got to the place where it was agitating his spirit, people coming up to him, he had become famous, and they wantin’ him to pray for them and all that. . . . You can’t manage that today, this dope-filled world, and get in a long tube with a bunch of demons.
